summer amateur radio activities. Andy's summer QTH was South Truro, Mass, USA better know as "Cape Cod", located at a site 15m above sea level and 200m from the shore.

VHF operations on 2 meters were done with a Radio Shack HTX-202 utilizing its rubber ducky antenna from both inside and outside a small wooden house. Power came for the handy talkie came from its own rechargeable battery operating with 1 watt input.

With the help of the "Dennis" repeater WA1AIC on 147.045Mhz, VA2 ASS/W1 was able to enter some Cape Cod networks which included the "The Weather Net", "The Message Net," and "the Emergency Net."

"The Emergency Net" participation was done on simplex over the frequency of 145.580 MHz. Power was supplied from a 12 Volt gel Motormaster power system by Canadian Tire. The Antenna was a 1/4 wave whip from a coat hanger installed on the roof (and joined with coax). The emergency net was directed by WQ10, Frank, for The American Red Cross and the ARRL. On simplex the signals were all Q5 but S1 to S3 only. We were 13 participants and the message handling was satisfactory.

The weekly "Emergency" was organized through the Dennis Repeater with actual the operation conducted exclusively on Simplex and battery power for all participants.

The Dennis repeater had a constant S9 signal for all participants on the Cape.

DXing on 2 meters on Simplex with 4 to 5 watts and the roof antenna was quite good and occasionally reaching Boston, Nantucket, Martha's Vineyard and even southern Maine.

Social activities for the Cape Cod hams included a weekly get together for breakfast at Harwich and once a month for a pic-nic lunch. OM's, XYL's and family were present. (in Orleans).

The members of the emergency net had a meeting every 2 weeks with a speaker on the subject. (Otis Air Force Base, and Regional Schools)

Andy concludes his thoughts on his Cape Cod adventure by saying, "I made made good friends and had a lot of fun. HF reception is excellent on the Cape, and I was sorry I didn't have my rig with me. But, there is always a next time!"
